### 4. First Aid Measures

**Emergency and First Aid****Procedures:**

- In Case of Inhalation:** If inhaled, remove to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. If breathing is difficult, give oxygen. Get medical aid.

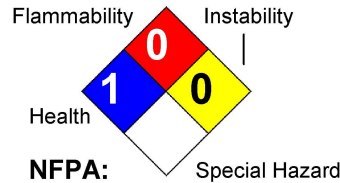
